RECYCLING PICK UP - WEDNESDAYS

The City of Pasadena presently operates a pilot recycling program in your neighborhood for the betterment of the community. Therefore let everyone do his or her part to make it a complete success. The City of Pasadena Waste Department issues BIG BLUE BAGS for the recycling program, allowing you to co-mingle glass, aluminum, tin and plastic.

Based on the schedule below, Waste Management will pick up recyclables at your curbside on every Wednesday. Note below which Wednesdays are for general recyclables and which are for newspaper recycling. We suggest that you tape this reminder under your kitchen sink cabinet or near your kitchen waste area for reference. Please read the instructions on the reverse side of this sheet on how to prepare these items for pickup.

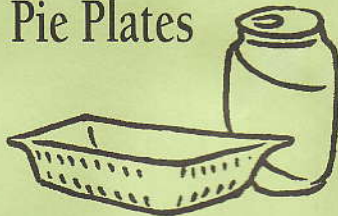

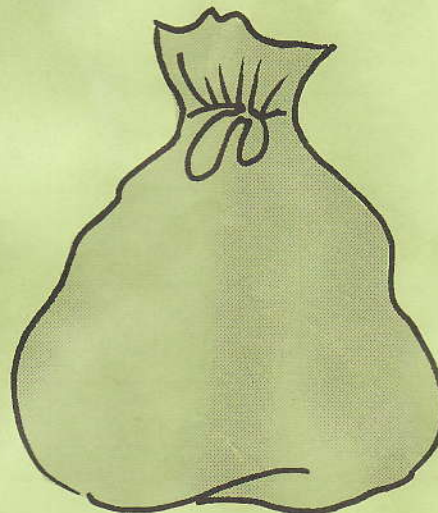
